
## Dennis Scott to perform on the George Wright Allen organ!

Dennis Scott has worn many musical hats since his days at the University of Tulsa where he majored in journalism -- not music.. He worked in public relations in Chicago for a number of years before becoming a full-time musician. During the late 1970s, he traveled as a concert artist for an electronic organ company before getting involved in the pizza organ circuit, working in San Francisco and Detroit. He claims that was like playing for Vaudeville every night!. During those "pizza years" he also began accompanying short silent movies (20 minute two-reelers) as part of his evening's entertainment schedule. Working from a large library of two-reelers he played most of those films "cold" and quickly developed his improvisational skills while watching those films for the first time with the audience! This is much the same way it happened for the silent movie organists of the 1920s.

In recent years with a renewed interest in classic silent films, Dennis has been in increasing demand. Since his return to Chicago in 1992, he has played many solo organ programs around the Great Lakes, but he is by his own admission, most at home playing silent film presentations. He played intermissions for more than six years at the Music Box Theatre in Chicago. He is President of the Chicagoland Theatre Organ Society and a founder and President of the Silent Film Society of Chicago. (Chicagoland chapter members will be joining us this afternoon.)

Join us at the Rialto Theatre, Joliet on Sunday, June 26, 2005 to hear Don Springer on the world-class Barton theatre pipe organ! Don is no stranger to Chicago area theatre organ enthusiasts. He has performed at the original Sally's Stage in Chicago, all of the major theatre organ installations in the Chicago area, and has held the distinction of being 'house organist' during the last years of the Hinsdale Theatre's existence. Don has a keen love for old standards, and has the unique ability to emulate the great theatre organists of the past. He is particularly gifted as a devotee of Jesse Crawford and George Wright's technique. He has also performed with jazz/dance bands in concert with organ/orchestra duets, as well as featured solo performances too numerous to mention. Don began his study of music at the age 6, and his instructors include none other than Al Melgard who was staff organist at the Chicago Stadium. He studied Classical Organ Performance at DePaul University in Chicago, and has performed throughout the Midwest. He has been featured on Radio and Television, and has one CD to his credit which was produced with Jim Glass at the Hinsdale Theatre Wurlitzer/Kimball.
