I cannot pay for my oxygen, physical therapy, pain therapy, many medicines, and I have to get food from food pantries. Things are very hard.

I don't really want to go on Craig's list or e-bay, or advertise in a newspaper because I am not well enough to do all that is entailed for that, and the dangers inherent in that.

Would you know anyone who might be interested to purchase this organ, you, or would you know of anyone that might know someone? I am in a very sad and tragic situation, and I must sell personal possessions in order to survive. I hope you could please try to help me.

This is your official notice of the required business meeting to be held at the March 13th social—Rialto Theatre, Joliet.




Exciting young organist, Donnie Rankin to perform at the Rialto!
