#### RIALTO IS OPEN

The Rialto has been open since the end of October. Many, many shows have been booked especially for the Christmas season. Some have been sell out crowds. Lee was able to get in for three days with Brian from Peterson to complete the wiring. That is one project we can check off the list. It looks so clean in the console. All the "not used anymore" and wires that went nowhere are gone. A new configuration file was loaded to address the piston issue. That is off the to do list too. The console is finally maintenance friendly. That's our number one goal when redoing anything on this organ.



Toby Washburn came down December 2nd to completely tune the organ to A440. The organ played with the American Legion Band in December. Toby will be coming down to start rebuilding some of the chests that are in desperate need of help after the first of the year.

Before the asbestos issue happened, the theater did have the entire lobby and rotunda floor restored. All the cracks were filled in and fixed and the finish they put on is a mirror finish. It really looks beautiful. I can only imagine that is how it looked on opening day in 1926.

As of now our work crew is still not allowed in the basement and we have no idea when we will be. Whatever we can do has been done. Without our tools and supplies we are just waiting. Hopefully it won't be much longer.


